


The Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C 13th July, 2025

Fr David was ordained to the priesthood on 25 March 2000, just weeks after being diagnosed with breast cancer, a challenge that, like others in his life, he faced with unwavering courage and trust in God. This battle with cancer has been a constant presence throughout his priestly life.

Throughout his ministry, Fr David served in the communities of St Francis Xavier Cathedral Wollongong, and the parishes of Nowra, Camden, Campbelltown, Rosemeadow, and Albion Park, before being appointed the founding parish priest of St Mary MacKillop Catholic Parish, Oran Park in 2015. There, he helped form a thriving new faith community, always reminding his parishioners that a parish is "owned by God," and that all gifts are to be placed at the service of others.

Diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukaemia in late 2024, Fr David once again faced illness with grace and faith. He retired from parish ministry in October last year and entered palliative care in recent days, supported tenderly by his loving family, including his sister, and upheld by your prayers, something he cherished deeply in his final days.

Reflection from Deacon Sam

Today, we gather not only in sorrow but also in gratitude, mourning the loss of our beloved Fr David, who has gone to join the eternal embrace of our Lord. But beyond his ministry, Fr David was a man of profound faith, humility, and kindness. He didn't seek recognition or praise. His life was one of selflessness, marked by the humility of a servant. In his gentle spirit, we witnessed the face of Christ. Today, as we remember him, we are reminded of his words and actions, but even more so, we are reminded of his example. He taught us not just through what he said, but through how he lived. In his humility, his joy, his love for the Eucharist, and his compassion for others, he drew us closer to God and helped us to see His presence in the world. Though Fr David has left us, his legacy lives on in each of us. The love he showed, the faith he shared, the grace he gave us, are now ours to carry forward. We are called to live out the example he set, to be witnesses of God's love and truth, just as he was. And so, while we mourn his loss, we also celebrate the life he led—a life fully devoted to God and to each of us. Fr David has now entered into the eternal joy of God's Kingdom. We trust that he is welcomed with open arms into the glory of Heaven, where he will continue to pray for us and intercede on our behalf. May we find comfort in knowing that Fr David's journey on this earth was one of faithfulness and love. And as we continue our own journey, may we be inspired by his example, drawing ever closer to the heart of Christ, as he did. Rest in peace my dear friend, Fr David, faithful servant of God. You were not only my parish priest, but you were my friend, spiritual advisor and counsellor. You will be deeply missed, but your spirit will live on in our hearts forever. We pray that the angels and the saints and Mary take you by the hand and gently guide you into the arms of Jesus and into eternal life. Amen



Saints of the week

Saint Camillus of Lellis (1550 - 1614) Monday 14th July, 2025

He was born in Italy of a noble family. He became a soldier but his taste for gambling and riotous living eventually lost him everything. At the age of 25 he converted as the result of hearing a sermon. He twice tried to join the Capuchin friars but was rejected because of his poor health. Having had experience of hospitals from the inside, he determined to improve them, and he devoted the rest of his life to the care of the sick. He offered himself to the hospital of San Giacomo in Rome and eventually became its bursar. Hospitals were as filthy, and hospital staff as brutal and inadequate, then as they are in many places today. He introduced many reforms and founded a congregation of priests and lay brothers, the Servants of the Sick (later known as the Camillians) to serve the sick both spiritually and physically. He was ordained priest in 1584. He resigned as head of his congregation in 1607 but continued to look after and visit the sick almost until the day of his death.

St Bonaventure (1218 - 1274)

Tuesday 15th July, 2025

Bonaventure was born at Bagnoregio in Etruria in about 1218. He became a Franciscan in 1243 and studied philosophy and theology at the University of Paris. He became a famous teacher and philosopher, part of the extraordinary intellectual flowering of the 13th century. He was a friend and colleague of St Thomas Aquinas.

At this time the friars were still a new and revolutionary force in the Church, and their radical embracing of poverty and rejection of institutional structures raised suspicion and opposition from many quarters. Bonaventure defended the Franciscan Order and, after he was elected general of the order in 1255, he ruled it with wisdom and prudence. He is regarded as the second founder of the Order.

He declined the archbishopric of York in 1265 but was made cardinal bishop of Albano in 1273, dying a year later in 1274 at the Council of Lyons, at which the Greek and Latin churches were (briefly) reconciled.

Bonaventure wrote extensively on philosophy and theology, making a permanent mark on intellectual history; but he always insisted that the simple and uneducated could have a clearer knowledge of God than the wise.

He was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1588 by Pope Sixtus V.
