The firstfruits of hope (Rom 8:19-25)

The Season of Creation is increasingly becoming a well-established time in the Church's liturgical year. This year's theme is 'to hope and act with creation'. It is a special time, during which Christians reflect on their relationships between God, people and all creation and come together for prayer and action to demonstrate their love and commitment. During the season of creation, we are invited to consider how hope doesn't mean passively waiting or standing still, but rather being actively engaged. Noticing what moves us, we can discern how

Christian hope, too, is not superficial, but rather has deep roots in the Creator's plans. We see ourselves as part of a bigger picture and rejoice in boundless creative possibilities for the common good. Sharing the sacred land of the Dharawal people, the parish of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop at Leppington and Oran Park is a family of diverse families.


We are sustained by the **Sacraments** and nurtured in our faith in **Jesus Christ.**
