Sharing the sacred land of the Dharawal people, the parish of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop at Leppington and Oran Park is a family of diverse families.


We are sustained by the **Sacraments** and nurtured in our faith in **Jesus Christ.**

RCIC MASS

The 2023 RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children)
Mass will be held on Tuesday, 13 June. As there will be 11 candidates receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, this 7pm Mass may be extended by up to 30 minutes.

Please pray for these candidates as they continue their faith journeys.

We are inviting those adults who might like to discern becoming a Catholic-Christian to take part in our parish RCIA program, that will begin in late July 2023 and go through to the Easter Vigil 2024.

RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

RCIA isn't a program, it's a process, a journey: that won't finish at the Easter Vigil next year, when those who are ready will receive the Sacraments, but will shape the course of the rest of their lives.
