

The parable of the mustard seed, as found in this weekend's Gospel of Luke is a profound lesson on the power of small beginnings. Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed, which starts as one of the smallest of seeds but grows into a large tree where birds can make their nests.

Spiritually, this parable invites us to reflect on the power of faith, even when it feels insignificant. Just as a tiny mustard seed, seemingly too small to amount to much, can grow into something great, so too can our small acts of faith, love, and obedience lead to immense transformation in our lives and the world.

The Kingdom of God is not always immediate or spectacular in its growth, but it grows quietly, steadily. In our own spiritual journey, we may feel as though our efforts are small or unnoticed. But God can take even the most humble offerings—our small prayers, acts of kindness, moments of forgiveness – and use them to bring about great things in His Kingdom.

This reflection reminds us that our faith, no matter how small it may seem, is never insignificant in the eyes of God. It is in His hands that it will grow and flourish. We are called to nurture that seed with prayer, grace, and trust, knowing that God is at work in ways we may not immediately see.

We are people of the mustard seed and we have been from the very beginning. We endure. We grow. We reach out to those who need shelter, and protection, and shade, offering blessed reminders and a witness of the mercy and love of God.

And, against all odds, we prevail. That is our faith. This is our hope. Our ancestors planted the seed of God's kingdom in this country. Now it is up to us to nurture it, and protect it, and see that it continues to grow.



The historical accounts of Saint Denis and his companions, which include


Saints Rusticus and Eleutherius, suggest that they were sent by

Pope Fabian in the 3rd century to evangelize the pagan populations of

Gaul (modern-day France).

Denis is particularly noted for his missionary work in Paris, where he

preached the Christian faith and baptized many converts. The martyrdom of Saint Denis is a significant aspect of his legacy. He and his companions were arrested for their faith and subsequently executed. The most famous account describes how Denis, after being decapitated, is said to have picked up his head and walked several miles while preaching a final sermon. This miraculous act symbolizes his steadfast faith and the triumph of the Christian spirit over persecution. Basilica of Saint-Denis, became a major pilgrimage site and the burial place for many French kings. St. Denis is invoked for protection and intercession.



ADVENT GROUPS 2025

ADVENT BEGINS ON 30 NOVEMBER.

IN RESPONSE TO ONE OF THE GOALS IN OUR PARISH PASTORAL PLAN, WHICH FOCUSES ON ENCOURAGING PARISHIONERS TO MEET IN SMALL GROUPS, THIS YEAR WE WOULD LIKE TO INVITE EVERYONE TO PARTICIPATE IN AN ADVENT GROUP.

WHAT HAPPENS IN AN ADVENT GROUP?

IT IS AN OPPORTUNITY, AS A MEMBER OF

OUR PARISH, TO GATHER 'IN SMALL GROUPS' TO REFLECT ON THE ADVENT SCRIPTURES, TO SHARE YOUR FAITH, TO PRAY AND TO 'GET TO KNOW' FELLOW PARISHIONERS OUTSIDE THE CONTEXT OF THE WEEKLY MASS. A SESSION GOES FOR ABOUT 90 MINS, AND GROUPS USUALLY FINISH WITH A CUPPA OR SUPPER (PROVIDED BY THE PARTICIPANTS WHO ARE ENCOURAGED TO BRING SOMETHING TO SHARE). WE ARE LOOKING AT RUNNING A NUMBER OF ADVENT GROUPS TO BE HELD IN THE SACRISTY AT OUR NORTHERN MASS CENTRE AT ST MARY MOTHER OF GOD, LEPPINGTON, OR ONE OF THE MEETING ROOMS TO SENTING AT OUR SOUTHERN MASS CENTRE AT ORAN PARK AS WELL AS GROUPS JUST FOR THE MEN OF THE PARISH, THE WOMEN OF THE PARISH, YOUNG MARRIED COUPLES, SENIOR PARISHIONERS, THOSE IN THEIR 20S/30S. WE ARE ALSO HAPPY IF YOU WOULD PREFER TO FACILITATE AN ADVENT GROUP IN YOUR HOME.

WE ARE NOW ON THE LOOK-OUT FOR THOSE WHO MAY BE INTERESTED IN
BEING A HOST/FACILITATOR – IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO ASSIST, PLEASE WRITE
YOUR NAME, CONTACT DETAILS AND THE DAY OF THE WEEK AND TIME WHEN YOU
WOULD LIKE YOUR GROUP TO MEET ON THE SHEET AVAILABLE AT THE WELCOME TABLE.
YOU ARE ALSO ASKED TO INDICATE IF YOU WISH TO BE A HOST AND/OR FACILITATOR –
AND IF YOU HAVE A SPECIFIC GROUP YOU WISH TO HOST/FACILITATE, AS WELL AS IF YOU
WANT TO SUGGEST A VENUE FOR THE GROUP. WE HOPE TO FINALISE ALL GROUP HOSTS
AND FACILITATORS OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS, SO WE CAN THEN ASK PEOPLE TO SIGN
UP TO PARTICIPATE IN A GROUP.

Save the Date – Formation Opportunities in Liturgy

Two Formation Opportunities in Liturgy will take place on Saturday 1 November at Holy Family Parish, **Ingleburn**.
