### POPE'S LETTER TO CHRISTIANS OF THE HOLY LAND

Pope Francis has issued a letter to the Christians of the Holy Land, expressing his solidarity with a community that continues to suffer amid the ongoing Israel-Hamas war.

"Dear brothers and sisters, allow me to tell you once more that you are not alone. We will never leave you alone but will demonstrate our solidarity with you by prayer and practical charity," the Pope wrote. "In these bleak times, when it seems that the dark clouds of Good Friday hover over your land, and all too many parts of our world are scarred by the pointless folly of war – which is always and for everyone a bitter defeat – you are lamps shining in the night, seeds of goodness in a land rent asunder by conflict".

Sharing the sacred land of the Dharawal people, the parish of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop at Leppington and Oran Park is a family of diverse families.


We are sustained by the **Sacraments** and nurtured in our faith in Jesus Christ.

## CLOTHING DONATION BIN NOW LOCATED AT ORAN PARK CHURCH

As Pope Francis has reminded us, we need to care for the environment in a serious and effective manner, and recycling is one important means to this end. Fr David (Parish Priest of St Mary MacKillop Parish) is pleased to announce that the St Mary MacKillop Parish have partnered with Australia's largest collector of textiles for re-use, re-purpose, and recycling, SCR Group to make a clothing donation bin once again available next to the Oran Park Mass Centre.

The mandate of SCRgroup is focused on diverting 100 per cent of their collections from landfill through re-homing unwanted clothing in local and international communities that need them the most. Where clothing is unfit for wear, SCRgroup converts them into rags and biofuel. They are also working to convert textile waste into products for resale.

In light of this mandate – and as clearly shown on the graphic that is found on the front of the donation bin - the only items that can be placed in our newly installed SCR group donation bin are clothing, shoes, handbags and fashion accessories. Those wishing to donate other items (such as toys or household items) are asked to drop these off at charity stores and other charity providers.



### Giving / Stewardship

**First Offering** – at time of Offertory - supports the clergy of our Diocese.

**Second Offering** – after distribution of Communion - helps with all the costs related to supporting the ministries and works of our parish: including parish staff wages, loan repayments, utilities, liturgy expenses, etc.

Do you want to learn more about the Church's vision for a just and peaceful world? Do you want to discover how you can be an agent of change in your community? Do you want to meet other people who share your passions and interests?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, then you are invited to attend a Workshop, to be co-hosted by our Parish and the Macarthur Social Justice Network (MSJN) in the Penola Room (next to our Oran Park Church) on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May from 2pm – 3.30pm, followed by afternoon tea.

The workshop will be led by Sean Donovan, Secretary of MSJN and former chair of Wollongong Diocese Justice Ecology and Peace Council, who will give an Introduction to Catholic Social Teaching. Catholic Social Teaching is the Church's body of principles and values that guide us in our response to the social issues of our time. It is based on the Gospel message of Jesus and the teachings of the popes and bishops.

The workshop will cover topics such as:

- Human dignity and human rights
- The common good and solidarity
- The option for the poor and the vulnerable
- The care for creation and the environment
- The method of see, judge, act for social action

The presentation is ideal starter for anyone new to Catholic Social Teaching or as a refresher for people who have been involved in the past. Sean will provide an overview of the key concepts and principles of Catholic Social Teaching. There will be time for refreshments, meeting others and discussion.

One of the hopes following this meeting, is that some people who attend might like to come together to form our own 'Parish Social Justice Group' here in the Parish.
