

### FEAST OF THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



APOSTLE OF SLAVE

9 SEPTEMBER

In 1610, this Jesuit left **Spain** for Cartagena, Colombia to become a defender and father to the African slaves, whom he consoled, catechized and confessed until his death. The humble priest who became the conscience of the city baptized around 300,000 slaves. His feast day is 9 Sep. When Peter, ordained in 1616, made his final profession as a Jesuit in 1622, he signed his vows:

"PETER CLAVER,
THE SLAVE OF THE AFRICANS FOREVER."

ST JOHN CHRYSOSTOM, BISHOP, DOCTOR

MEMORIAL - 13 SEPTEMBER

John Chrysostom, or "golden-mouthed," placed his gift with words at the service of the Word. He became the bishop of Constantinople, where his clear preaching earned him enemies. The great preacher, who died in exile, is one of the most prolific of the Fathers of the Church.


May **UKRAINE** keep the flame of hope alive each day





Antonia Salzano, the mother of Carlo Acutis, has stated that she once viewed the sacraments as mere symbols, likening her previous understanding to that of a Protestant. She explained that before her son's influence, she thought the Eucharist "didn't mean anything" and was "terribly ignorant" about the Catholic faith. It was through Carlo's deep devotion and his explanations that she came to understand the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, calling this realization "the most important discovery of my life". She credits Carlo with saving her faith and helping her embrace the fullness of the Catholic Church.
