

LITURGY OF THE WORD

1st **READING** Is 11:1–10:

He judges the poor with justice.



R. Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

2nd READING Rom 15:4-9: Christ, the hope of all people.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia! (Lk 3:4, 6)

GOSPEL Mt 3:1–12: Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.

Have you ever heard the saying "great things come to those who wait".

As we gather today in this second week of this holy season of Advent, the Church invites us to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ.

For generations, God's people waited with longing and hope for the One who would fulfill every promise. This anticipation spanned hundreds of generations, tracing Jesus's; lineage back through the house of David, from Abraham to the prophets and kings purposefully woven into salvation history, leading us to the birth of the King of Kings and the Prince of peace.

Yet this King, the long-awaited Messiah, entered our world not in splendor but in humility—born in a simple manger, a guest room, reminding us that God comes quietly, gently, and in unexpected ways. As we continue our Advent journey, may our hearts become a fitting dwelling place for Christ, and may we welcome Him with the same hope and anticipation that guided God's people through the ages.

We are reminded in today's readings about waiting for the coming of the Lord with high hopes. This does not mean waiting in relaxation, but rather waiting in anticipation. In the midst of the noisy world where we live, let this voice of John the Baptist be heard in our hearts as St. Benedict suggests; listen with the ears of our hearts. Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. It is impossible to hear his voice if we shut our hearts from the hearing his word. The words of the Psalms are powerful to inspire us as we prepare to receive his message; if today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts (Psalm 95: 7-8).

8 DEC: THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

9 DEC: SAINT JUAN DIEGO CUAUHTLATOATZIN.

He is said to have been granted apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe on four occasions in December 1531

10 DEC: OUR LADY OF LORETO

Patron Saint of aviators and builders.

11 DEC: SAINT DAMASUS I

Pope Damasus I c. 305 – 11 December 384), also known as Damasus of Rome, was the bishop of Rome from October 366 to his death in 384.

He presided over the Council of Rome of 382 that determined the canon or official list of sacred scripture.

Damasus spoke out against major heresies

(including Apollinarianism and Macedonianism), thus solidifying the faith of the Catholic Church, and encouraged production of the Vulgate Bible with his support for Jerome. He helped reconcile the relations between the Church of Rome and the Church of Antioch, and encouraged the veneration of martyrs.

12 DEC: OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Our Lady of Guadalupe, also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe, is a Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary associated with four Marian apparitions to Juan Diego and one to his uncle, Juan Bernardino reported in December 1531, when the Mexican territories were part of the Spanish Empire.

A venerated image on a cloak (tilmahtli) associated with the apparition is enshrined in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. Pope Leo XIII granted a decree of canonical coronation for the image on 8 February 1887.

Aboard the papal plane returning to Rome from Lebanon, Pope Leo XIV speaks to journalists about the role of the Holy See, which works "behind-the-scenes" in peace negotiations, so that all parties may lay down arms. Regarding Ukraine, the Pope underlines Europe's involvement and the important role Italy could play, and answers a question about how he reacted to his election, stressing the importance of giving one's life to God and letting him "lead the way".

Sri Lanka: Local Christian communities offer aid to victims of Cyclone Ditwah

As flooding and landslides continue to devastate Southeast Asia, Catholic and Christian parishes and organizations step up to offer support and "together to alleviate the suffering of the victims."

A report presenting the results of the Commission's work has been released. It rules out admitting women to the diaconate understood as a degree of the sacrament of Holy Orders, but says that it is not currently possible "to formulate a definitive judgment, as in the case of priestly ordination."

Catholic community growing in Türkiye

As Pope Leo XIV arrives in Türkiye on the first leg of his first Apostolic Journey, Fr. Alexander Jernej, CM, describes the context of the Christian community in the majority Muslim country. While Türkiye is 99% Muslim, Christianity and Judaism are also present in the country.

As the Church enters the sacred Season of Advent, Zimbabwe's Catholic Bishops' Conference (ZCBC) has released a Pastoral Statement titled "Advent Pastoral Message – Remember the Poor," in which it invites Zimbabweans to use the period as a time of national renewal, both social and spiritual

A look at the Council of Nicaea's impact on the Church As Pope Leo XIV visits the site of the Council of Nicaea, held in 325, we recall the importance of the first Ecumenical Council's proclamation of the Church's faith in the divinity of Jesus Christ, which also established the date for Easter for all Christians.

The doctrinal Note Una caro. In Praise of Monogamy has been published, exploring the value of marriage as an "exclusive union and mutual belonging." 
WHAT IS ADVENT?

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34–36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

Advent is the season that precedes Christmas. It varies in length from 22–28 days. During this season, Catholics, and other Christians, enter a time of hopeful anticipation and joyful preparation for the celebration of Christmas. Advent and Christmas offer us the opportunity to prayerfully commemorate the birth of Jesus, to become more aware of God's presence in our everyday lives and to reflect on the second coming of Jesus at the end of time (Vatican. Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 675).


