

LITURGY OF THE WORD

1st READING Num 21:4-9: When those that were afflicted looked upon it, they were healed.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 77:1-2, 34-38:

THE HOLY CROSS IS THE SIGN OF HOPE FOR SALVATION

This Sunday we commemorate the Feast of the Exultation of the Cross. This feast is celebrated to honor the discovery of the true cross, which Jesus was hung by St. Helena the mother of Constantine in 326. After the death and the resurrection of Jesus, the Jews and the Romans hid the Holy Sepulchre (Christ's tomb) and his cross. Earth was mounded up and pagan temple built on top. St. Helena was inspired to travel to Jerusalem in search for the true cross. Three crosses were eventually found. Helena and Saint Macarius, bishop of Jerusalem, devised an experiment to determine which was the True Cross. The crosses were taken to a woman near death; when she touched the True Cross, she was healed. Another tradition says the body of a dead man was laid upon each cross. The True Cross restored the man to life. Constantine constructed churches at the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary. Those churches were dedicated and the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross was celebrated. Last couple of weeks in the gospel, Jesus insisted on his disciples if you want to become my follower, deny yourself and carry your cross. Today the church invites us that we should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered. At Lent, we pray the Stations of the Cross. We united in praying; we adore you O Christ and we bless you. 

Patron Saints of Korea

During the period Catholicism was suppressed many had to practise their faith covertly. Kim was one of thousands who were executed during this time. In 1846, at the age of 25, he was tortured and finally beheaded near Seoul on the Han River. His last words were: "This is my last hour of life, listen to me attentively: if I have held communication with foreigners, it has been for my religion and my God. It is for Him that I die. My immortal life is on the point of beginning. Become Christians if you wish to be happy after death, because God has eternal chastisements in store for those who have refused to know Him"





A new K-12 college for 1,800 students in southwest Sydney will be named after the newly minted saint, Carlo Acutis.

The Catholic Church will commemorate the **liturgical memorial** of St. Carlo Acutis on Oct. 12 and of St. Pier Giorgio Frassati on July 4.

The two young men were canonized Sept. 7 by Pope Leo XIV in St. Peter's Square at the Vatican.

In the case of St. Carlo Acutis, the Italian teenager who died in 2006 and was beatified in Assisi in October 2020, his feast day was set for Oct. 12, coinciding with the anniversary of his death from fulminant leukemia at the age of 15.

Pier Giorgio Frassati, a young man from Turin who died in 1925 and was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1990, will be commemorated every year on July 4, also coinciding with the day of his death. His memorial Mass is celebrated especially in Italy and in youth communities that consider him a patron and spiritual role model.
