
Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Saints of the week

St. Bridget, Religious, Patron of Europe Wednesday 23rd July, 2025

St. Bridget of Sweden, also known as St. Birgitta, was a religious figure and **one of the six patron saints of Europe**, along with St. Benedict of Nursia, St. Cyril and St. Methodius, St. Catherine of Siena, and St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

Born in Sweden & married at the age of 13, they had eight children, including St. Catherine of Sweden.

After the death of her husband, she devoted her life to Christ and founded the **Bridgettines**, also known as the Order of the Most Holy Savior, in 1346 (approved by Pope Urban V in 1370).

St. Bridget is known for her mystical experiences and visions, which included revelations from God and **descriptions of Purgatory**. She also had a deep relationship with God, which included additional visions of Jesus. She is the patron saint of Sweden and is also known as the **patroness of widows** and for a **holy death**.

St Christine, Virgin & Martyr

Thursday 24th July 2025

Christina was a young woman who, on account of her love of Christ, found enemies within her own family. She was tortured by her own father to induce her to renounce her faith. After his death, the torture continued, until, shot by arrows, she won the crown of martyrdom.

St. Charbel Makhlouf, priest (1828-1898)

Thursday 24th July

Sunday, 20th July 2025 (Maronite Calendar)

A Maronite Catholic priest known for his deep devotion to prayer, asceticism, and miracles both during and after his life.

Born as **Youssef Antoun Makhlouf** in 1828 in Lebanon, he entered religious life at the age of 23 and was ordained a priest in 1859.

Spent 16 years at monastery before living as a **hermit**. Known for his rigorous asceticism and profound union with God. Died on Christmas Eve in 1898 after suffering a stroke while celebrating the Divine Liturgy.

His tomb has been a site of pilgrimage since his death, with numerous miracles attributed to his intercession.
