LITURGY OF THE WORD

1st **READING** Amos 8:4-7: The Lord God spoke against those who buy the poor for money.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 112:1-2, 4-8: R. Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor.

2nd **READING** 1 Tim 2:1-8: Let prayers be offered to God for everyone; he wants all people to be saved.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus Christ was rich but he became poor, to make you rich out of his poverty. Alleluia! (2 Cor 8:9)

GOSPEL Lk 16:1-13: You cannot be slaves both of God and of money.

This weekend's scripture reading contains the Parable of the Unjust Steward, which presents a complex lesson on stewardship, worldly wisdom, and loyalty to God.

In the parable, a rich man hears that his steward has been squandering his possessions and decides to fire him. The steward, realizing that he is about to lose his job, acts shrewdly by reducing the debts of his master's debtors, hoping they will repay him by offering hospitality after he is dismissed. The master commends the steward for his prudence, not for his dishonesty but for his cleverness in securing his future.

At first glance, it might seem like Jesus is promoting unethical behaviour, but the key message is not about dishonesty but about wisdom and preparedness. Jesus calls his followers to be just as wise in securing their eternal future as the steward was in securing his earthly future.

The parable invites us to reflect on how we handle the resources God has entrusted to us. Are we acting with the same urgency and foresight for our spiritual lives as we do for our material needs? Do we use what we have in terms of time, talents, and treasures in order to advance God's Kingdom? And, importantly, do we recognize that our loyalty must ultimately lie with God, not with the fleeting comforts of this world?

At times in our lives, we find ourselves in difficult and frightening situations. At these times do we turn to God? Do we trust God to give us another chance? The gift is: God always gives us another chance! Our part is to trust that God will never leave us!

The call is clear: We are stewards, and our greatest wealth lies in our relationship with God, not in our material possessions. The way we manage both can reveal where our hearts truly lie.

Despite facing investigations, restrictions on his ministry, and periods of suffering, including spiritual attacks and physical pain, he remained steadfast in his faith & obedience to Church authority. His life was marked by reported mystical

experiences, including the ability to read souls, bilocation, and levitation.



27 SEP: ST. VINCENT DE PAUL (1581-1660)

French Catholic priest renowned for his dedication to serving the poor and marginalized. Venerated as a saint in both the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion. His life was marked

by profound compassion, humility, and a commitment to charitable works, leading to the founding of the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians) and the Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul.



WHAT IS STIGMATA?

STIGMATA REFERS TO THE MIRACULOUS APPEARANCE OF THE WOUNDS OF JESUS CHRIST'S CRUCIFIXION ON A PERSON'S BODY.

THESE WOUNDS USUALLY APPEAR IN THE SAME PLACES WHERE CHRIST WAS INJURED DURING HIS PASSION:


- HANDS OR WRISTS (NAIL MARKS)
- FEET (NAIL MARKS)
- SIDE (WHERE CHRIST WAS PIERCED WITH A LANCE)
- SOMETIMES ON THE FOREHEAD (CROWN OF THORNS) OR BACK (SCOURGING MARKS)

IMPORTANT FACTS:

- STIGMATA ARE CONSIDERED A SUPERNATURAL GIFT GIVEN TO SOME MYSTICS WHO SHARE DEEPLY IN CHRIST'S SUFFERING.
- THEY MAY BE VISIBLE AND BLEEDING, OR INVISIBLE BUT PAINFULLY FELT.
- THE PHENOMENON CANNOT BE EXPLAINED BY NATURAL CAUSES AND IS VERY RARE.
- THE CHURCH INVESTIGATES SUCH CASES CAREFULLY TO RULE OUT FRAUD, ILLNESS, OR PSYCHOLOGICAL CAUSES.





PADRE PIO LIVED WITH THE VISIBLE WOUNDS OF CHRIST FOR 50 YEARS, ENDURING THE PAIN HUMBLY AND OFFERING IT AS A SACRIFICE FOR SOULS. HIS STIGMATA WAS ONE OF THE MOST WELL-DOCUMENTED IN HISTORY. SHORTLY BEFORE HIS DEATH ON SEPTEMBER 23, 1968, THE WOUNDS COMPLETELY HEALED, LEAVING NO SCARS — ANOTHER UNEXPLAINED PHENOMENON.

The Catholic & Greek Orthodox clergy and religious in Gaza have confirmed they will stay to care for all those who wish to remain, despite recent evacuation orders. More than 700 Christians, including children & the elderly, are sheltering in the Catholic Holy Family parish & the Orthodox compound of St Porphyrius.
