Join Us This October


Walk in memory of **Fr David Catterall** as we come together to raise funds and awareness for cancer. Let's honour his legacy, support a meaningful cause, and make every step count

1 OCT: ST. THERESE OF CHILD JESUS / THÉRÈSE OF LISIEUX (MEMORIAL)

A French Discalced Carmelite nun who became one of the most popular saints in the history of the Catholic Church. In 1997, Pope St. John Paul II declared her the thirty-third Doctor of the Church, the youngest person and only the third woman to receive this honor, recognizing her profound spiritual wisdom despite her limited formal writings. She is the patroness of missions, florists, gardeners, the loss of parents, and Russia & is also considered the co-patron of France. Died on 30 Sep 1897, aged 24, believing that her life was really just beginning for God, promising to spend her heaven doing good on earth. Her final words were, "Oh, my God, I love you!"


Blessing of Animals, Monday, 6 October at 9:30am.


WHO ARE ANGELS? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, angels are pure spirits who serve God and are messengers of His will (CCC 328-336). Among these angels, Michael is often depicted as a warrior angel who combats evil. The Catechism refers to the spiritual battle that exists between good and evil, and Michael is traditionally seen as the chief defender against the forces of evil, particularly Satan. The Church honors Gabriel, along with Michael and Raphael, on the feast of the Archangels, celebrated on September 29.

This feast acknowledges the significant roles that these archangels play in the divine plan and their

is recognized in all three major religions of the world. He is mentioned by name in the Book of Tobit and 1 Enoch. Jewish tradition tells us Raphael was one of three heavenly visitors entertained by Abraham at the Oak of Mamre. In the Book of Tobit, Raphael identifies himself as "the angel Raphael, one of the seven, who stand before the Lord" (Tobit 12:15, NABRE). He is sent by God to heal Tobit and to guide Tobias on his journey, ultimately leading to the healing of Tobit's sight.





St. Michael, The Archangel

The biblical basis for St. Michael's role can be found in the Book of Revelation, where he leads the heavenly hosts in battle against the dragon (often interpreted Satan) 12:7-9). (Revelation Additionally, in the Book of Daniel, Michael is described as a protector of Israel and leader among angels (Daniel 10:13, 12:1).



MESSENGER

St. Gabriel, The Archangel

Gabriel is mentioned in the Bible as an angel who delivers important messages from God. In the Gospel of Luke, he is notably the angel who announces the birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah (Luke 1:11-20) and the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary regarding the Incarnation of Jesus (Luke 1:26-38). These events highlight Gabriel's role as a divine messenger, bringing significant news that has profound implications for salvation history. Gabriel is also mentioned in the Book of Daniel in the Old Testament, where he interprets visions and provides insight to the prophet Daniel (Daniel 8:16-26; 9:21-27). This further establishes Gabriel as a key figure in the communication of divine knowledge and prophecy.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church addresses the existence of EVIL SPIRITS, primarily in the context of the Church's teaching on angels and the reality of spiritual warfare. Evil spirits, often referred to as demons, are understood as fallen angels who have rebelled against God and now seek to lead humanity away from Him. According to the Catechism, angels are created beings with free will, and some chose to reject God's will and grace. This rebellion led to their fall from grace, and they became evil spirits (CCC 414). The Catechism notes that these fallen angels are in opposition to God and His creation, actively working to tempt and harm humanity. The existence of evil spirits is affirmed in Scripture, where they are depicted as adversaries of God and His people. For example, in the Gospels, Jesus encounters and exorcises demons, demonstrating His authority over them (Mark 1:23-26; Luke 8:26-39). The Catechism emphasizes that these spirits are real and can influence individuals, seeking to lead them into sin and away from God (CCC 394). Evil spirits are often associated with various forms of temptation, deception, and spiritual oppression. The Catechism encourages the faithful to be vigilant against these influences and to rely on God's grace, the sacraments, and the intercession of saints to resist evil (CCC 409). In summary, evil spirits are understood as fallen angels who oppose God and seek to lead humanity into sin. The Church teaches that they are real entities that can influence human behavior, and the faithful are called to be aware of their presence while relying on God's strength to resist their temptations.
